

## Summary of relevant skills and experiences

Federico Azzarri is Assistant Professor in Private Law at the Department of Law, University of Pisa. After obtaining the Ph.D. in Private Law at the University of Pisa (2013), with a dissertation about the passing of risk in the European Contract Law, during his post-doc fellowship at the Scuola Superiore Sant'Anna of Pisa he took part to the Project "Robolaw - Regulating Emerging Robotic Technologies in Europe: Robotics facing Law and Ethics", funded by the 7th Framework Programme. He worked with European researchers in order to elaborate the "Guidelines on regulating robotics" containing regulatory suggestions for the European Commission. His field of survey were the surgical robots.

He took part in the Summer School in European Private Law organized by the Salzburg Universität (2010) and he spent periods of research at the Max-Planck-Institut für ausländisches und internationales Privatrecht of Hamburg (February 2015, February and November 2016, November 2017). He developed a comparative methodology of research, with particular regard to the European and German Law, to which he dedicated some essays concerning Family law and the legal protection of the gender identity. He has been a member of the unity of research headed by Prof. Navarretta (University of Pisa) in the National scientific project on Lisbon Treaty and European private law financed by the Italian Ministry of Education, Universities and Research. His book "Res perit domino e diritto europeo. La frantumazione del dogma" has been awarded with the "Francesco Santoro Passarelli" Prize by the Accademia Nazionale dei Lincei, the oldest scientific academy worldwide.
