

## Summary of relevant skills and experiences

Valentina Bonini is Assistant Professor of Criminal Procedure at the Department of Law of the University of Pisa.

Her teaching experience started 15 years ago (at the Naval Academy of Livorno, and then at the University of Pisa) and deals with criminal procedural in general and restorative justice in particular: in this context, she works with frontal teaching, seminars, practical exercises, meetings with the judiciary and counsels of the criminal trial. Her teaching experience is developed for undergraduate and graduate students, with lessons at the school for the legal professions (University of Pisa) and in the courses for the continuous training of lawyers (Bar of Pisa; Bar of Livorno; Bar of Lucca; Bar of Massa Carrara; Bar of La Spezia).

She has developed a more than 20-year research experience, also in cooperation with other universities (University of Bologna, University of Turin; University of Milan; University of Piemonte Orientale), thanks to the participation in several research projects of national interest (PRIN), often dealing with comparative perspective or supranational dimension (for inst. PRIN 2005, on the topic “The declarative evidence in the European judicial area: mutual recognition and prospects for harmonization”). Member of the workshop on mediation “*Un Altro Modo*”, which brings together experts in mediation (civil, commercial, family, international and criminal) of the Universities of Florence, Pisa and Siena. Her main fields of scientific interests are currently: victim and criminal trial, criminal mediation, negotiated justice.
