

Summary of relevant skills and experiences

Elettra Stradella (Genova, 1980; mother of two girls) is Associate Professor of Comparative Public Law at the University of Pisa (Department of Law), where she currently teaches Law & Gender, Comparative Law of Territorial Autonomies, Constitutions and Social Rights. She is member of the Scientific Board of the Phd programme in Law, where she has supervised and presently supervises PhD candidates in Comparative Law. She is President of the “Comitato Unico di Garanzia” (Commission on equal opportunities and gender issues) of the University of Pisa, appointed by the Rector, working on equal opportunities, policies against discriminations in the academic community, and cultural dissemination on gender issues. Before joining the Department of Law, she has been fellow (Constitutional and Comparative Law) at the Scuola Superiore Sant’Anna of Pisa (2010/2011), Senior Visiting Scholar at the University of Gothenbourg, School of Business, Economics and Law (2010), and Post-Doc fellow at the Department of Political Sciences at the University of Pisa (2008/2010). She holds a PhD from the University of Pisa (2007), and an Excellence Degree (with honors) in Public Administration from the Scuola Sant’Anna (2004), after the Masters’ Degree in Political Sciences and Public Administration (with honors) from the University of Pisa. She’s author of 100 publications: among them, two authored books (on freedom of expression, 2008, and semi-presidential systems in Europe, 2013), many edited books in Italian and in English (on law and technology, welfare policies in Europe, right to health, etc.), and several articles on top Italian and international journals, even concerning gender issues (equal opportunities, gender mainstreaming, European strategies on gender equality, etc.).
